Summary: One of the purposes of this grant program is to expand technology resources to create or reinforce community technology infrastructure. The Amesbury Public Library will use awarded grant funds to replace eight of the Library's public computers and to purchase 2 iPad minis. Funds must be expended by 12/21/2023.

The City of Amesbury has a population of just over 17,000 people. About 30% of the population is under 25 years old, second only to the population group between 45 and 64 years of age. However, the average age of the city's population has been steadily increasing. Since 2010, Amesbury's median resident age has increased from 39.9 years to 43.9 years of age. About 94% of the population is White. Just over six percent of households in Amesbury live below the poverty line. However, many households in Amesbury do not make more than the regional living wage as estimated by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Amesbury residents vary in educational attainment. A quarter of the city's population holds a GED and another quarter holds a Bachelor's Degree. Amesbury residents have significantly higher educational attainment than residents county-wide. Roughly 40% of Amesbury residents hold a bachelor's degree or higher. The Library's operating budget has always met the MAR except FY21 when we were in waiver status due to cuts made during the COVID-19 pandemic. For FY23 our operating budget is about \$880,000 representing less than 1% of the overall municipal budget.

The Library does not have a dedicated technology budget line. Historically purchases of new technology including computers for the staff and public are funded from our State Aid funds as a crisis measure when machines have reached end of life. This has resulted in a lack of consistency in purchasing and a current public computer environment where the machines vary from five to up to ten years old. The grant would facilitate purchase of a full slate of public computers equipped with current software. Our community relies on this access to computers and to internet. Residents in our community have been impacted financially by the Covid-19 pandemic, consequently many rely on the library for dependable and consistent internet access. This hardware investment will ensure we are offering a dependable source of technology, including internet and printing services. Additionally, telecommuters, students, and lifelong learners, and job seekers utilize our resources via our public computers. Library resources such as the library catalog and databases as well as online resources including government websites, social services, and legal resources are consulted daily on these machines fulfilling a critical need for patrons. At present our public computers run slowly, often fail, exhibit functionality challenges weekly, and requiring staff intervention regularly. This disrupts use and limits access for our users. We would also like to replace our five-year-old iPad. We rely on the iPad to provide access to mobile circulation services during outreach events. This allows us to provide access to our collection to patrons unable to travel to our building. Our current building is non-ADA compliant. As we continue to identify ways to meet the needs of patrons with mobility issues we increasingly rely on these outreach events. Having stable and reliable technology for staff and

constituents to interact with off-site ensures we are providing the most equitable service we are able for patrons inside and outside our facility. Ideally, we would purchase two iPads to provide for a backup device in the case of failure or tech issues and to potentially reach more people.

We would use the grant funds to purchase eight Dell micro form desktop computers that cost about \$900 each and two iPad minis that cost \$499 each. This technology will be supported by a combination of Merrimack Valley Library Consortium (MVLC) staff, the City's IT department and library staff. MVLC provides us with the Microsoft and anti-virus software as part of our membership appropriation and includes support for those items along with general PC support ranging from virtual troubleshooting to on-site help.
