
2025-100 Appointment of Jennifer Welter to the position of member of the Historic Commission for a term to expire February 29, 2028 **Approved**

2025-082 An Order authorizing the Mayor to dispose of, by sale or lease, all or a portion or portions of City-owned property and any structures thereon consisting of approximately 4 +/- acres (180,000 SF +/-), which is a portion of the 14 acre +/- City-owned property located at 24 South Hampton Road (Parcel 26-4, formerly the site of the Amesbury Elementary School) as shown on Exhibit 1.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: As part of a land use and redevelopment assessment process administered by the Office of Community and Economic Development, the Mayor is requesting authorization to dispose of a 4-acre +/- portion or portions of the City-owned parcel located at 24 South Hampton Road in accordance with the requirements of G.L. c. 30B, sec. 16, to enable the creation of no more than thirty-six (36) dwelling units on approximately 4 acres +/- of the property and one (1) single-family dwelling unit on approximately 13,000 SF +/- of the property fronting along Rowell Street (as shown on Exhibit 1). The remaining property (10 acres +/-) will be retained by the City for use related but not limited to public park, drainage infrastructure, and/or other general municipal use(s) as needed. The disposition of all or a portion or portions of the 4 +/- acre portion of the property referenced herein will remove the obligation of maintenance and substantial demolition costs, limit liability of the City for that portion of the property, provide needed housing opportunities, place this portion of the property on the tax rolls, and provide the City with direct sale revenue. The selected developer(s) of the portion or portions of the property will be solely responsible for the design, permitting, and subdivision of the property as well as for the demolition, disposal, and redevelopment of the former Amesbury Elementary School facility. The redevelopment project will be subject to permitting by the Amesbury Planning Board under a Planned Unit Development - Special Permit



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(PUD-SP) and such plans shall be in substantial compliance with the conceptual building and site plan shown as attached in Exhibits 1 and 2. The property is also proposed to be rezoned to "R8" to match the abutting zoning district. The R-8 zoning district allows for single- and two-family uses as well as multi-family uses under the PUD-SP. Additionally, the selected developer will be required to comply with the affordability requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.



2025-105 An Order to transfer \$10,000 from the Assessors Department Salaries & Wages and \$35,000 from Salary Reserve account to Assessors Department Other Expenses.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: This order requests a budget transfer in the amount of \$45,000 from the Assessors Department Salaries & Wages and Salary Reserve to the Assessors Department Other Expenses for consulting services during transition/hiring of new Chief Assessor. **Referred to Budget & Finance (B&F)- Tues., October 21st at 6:30pm, Second Reading on October 28th**

2025-106 An Order to approve payment from the FY26 general fund operating budget for the below listed prior year invoices.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: The below listed invoices are for operating expenses related to supplies or services rendered in prior fiscal years but for which funds were not encumbered by the corresponding city department at fiscal year-end. This order requests payment be made to the listed vendors from the corresponding department's current year (FY25) operating budget in accordance with M.G.L. c. 44 s. 64. 2025-107 An Order to authorize a transfer of \$5,900.00 from the FY26 Budget Reserve account to Building Inspections Consulting.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: This order requests a budget transfer in the amount of \$5,900.00 from the FY26 Budget Reserve account to Building Inspections Consulting to pay a FY25 invoice for a 3rd party consultant that provided code consulting services to the Inspectional Services Department for the Munters project. **Referred to Budget & Finance (B&F)- Tues., October 21st at 6:30pm, Second Reading on October 28th**




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2025-108 An Order to authorize the Mayor to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$20,000.00 from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety and Security, Office of Grants and Research Edward J. Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: This grant award will be used to purchase additional portable radios for the command staff and patrol forces, specifically two dual band radios valued at \$16,000 and one single band radio valued at \$4,000. This new equipment will allow for greater communication capabilities and ultimately help the Amesbury Police Department meet state mandated communication requirements. **Referred to Budget & Finance (B&F)- Tues., October 21st at 6:30pm, Second Reading on October 28th**

2025-109 An Order to authorize the Mayor to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$34,967.00 from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety and Security, Office of Grants and Research FY26 Municipal Road Safety (MRS) Grant Program.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: This grant award will be used to fund traffic enforcement. This funding will allow the Police Department to increase the number of hours spent conducting selective enforcement to combat the most problematic areas, which include distracted drivers, impaired driving, and speeding. This is a cost reimbursement grant program with an end date of September 15, 2026. **Referred to Budget & Finance (B&F)- Tues., October 21st at 6:30pm, Second Reading on October 28th**

2025-110 An Ordinance to amend the Amesbury Code of Ordinances by adding a new Chapter titled "Chapter 230. Buildings, Permitting of" and to adopt a Schedule of Fees.- Mayor Sponsor Summary: The Office of Inspectional Services currently maintains a Schedule of Fees that was last updated in 2011, and it is lower than many neighboring communities. This creates both a revenue shortfall and a potential imbalance in how municipal services are funded. Raising fees (all building/plumbing/gas/electric) to align with comparable communities would ensure that Amesbury can adequately fund inspections, staffing, and administrative services, while maintaining fairness and competitiveness with surrounding communities. Through a comparative analysis of area communities' building and solar permit fees as well as reviewing the November 2021 Comprehensive Review of Municipal Fees by the Edward J. Collins, Jr. Center for Public Management, the Inspectional Services Department has provided the attached recommended Permit Fees. **Referred to Ordinance & Administration (O&A) – Mon. 2025-112 An Ordinance to update and amend the City of Amesbury Solid Waste Ordinance Chapter 392 to add a new section entitled Article III Delivery and Emptying of Dumpsters.- Councilor Gilday and Councilor Haggstrom Sponsors Summary: This ordinance will update Chapter 392 Solid Waste in the City Ordinances to create a new section for the delivery and emptying of solid waste dumpsters to specify an allowed time range, fine structure, and enforcement authority specifically for dumpster delivery and emptying on personal, business, commercial, and retail properties. **Referred to Ordinance & Administration (O&A) – Mon.
